Charlotte Teaching Team Featured on Cover of National Magazine

NAEYC's *Teaching Young Children* Celebrates and Supports the Work of Preschool Teachers

(Charlotte, North Carolina)– Caley Chase and Gabby Moore, a preschool teaching team at the NAEYC-accredited Bright Horizons Early Education and Back Up Center at Carillon, are being recognized for their work by being featured on the cover of NAEYC's *Teaching Young Children* (TYC).

“Caley and Gabby are a new teaching team that have found ways to bring the classroom alive,” said Program Director Margie Kelly. “Gabby has a strong science background and Caley brings with her the knowledge of how to prepare the children for kindergarten. Before landing a job at Bright Horizons, she spent four years working for Mad Science, a company that provides hands-on and interactive science activities for children. She says she hopes to continue teaching preschoolers because she knows how important it is to give them a good foundation.
