# **Watercolor Alphabet**

## **Learning Value:**

This activity will give your child the opportunity to build their knowledge of print and the alphabet while they discover letters through cause and effect.

#### **Materials Needed:**

- 26 white index cards
- White crayon
- Watercolor paint
- Water
- Paintbrushes

# **Participants:**

This activity is intended for adult/child interaction.

### **Directions:**

- **Step One:** With a white crayon, write one letter of the alphabet on each index card.
- Step Two: Provide paints, brushes and cards to your child and encourage them to paint over the cards.
- Step Three: As your child discovers the letters on each card, discuss their names and the sounds they make. Name a few words that start with each of the letters and encourage your child to think of one on their own.
- Step Four: If desired, after the cards dry, help your child punch a hole in each corner and bind them together with string or a binder clip.

#### Learn More:

Ask your child why they think the watercolor paints do not work on the white crayons. Introduce the concept of water resistance.
