Preschool Art: Sewing Leaves

Learning Value:

This introductory sewing experience builds children's focus and attention to detail. Participating in handcrafts is a satisfying way for young children to strengthen motor skills and explore a variety of materials.

Materials Needed:

- Leaves of various colors and sizes (soft leaves work best)
- Paper punch
- Yarn or string
- Masking tape
- Scissors

Participants:

This activity is intended for adult/child interaction and independent play.

Directions:

- Step 1: With your child, gather a few leaves from your yard or a nearby park. Look for a variety of colors, shapes, and sizes.
- Step 2: Help your child use the paper punch to make holes around the outside edges of the leaves.
- Step 3: Tear a small piece of masking tape (1 inch or less). Wrap it tightly around one end of the yarn or string. Cut the tape on an angle to make a "needle." You can also use plastic or blunt-ended needles.
- Step 4: Show your child how to sew the edge of the leaf by pushing the yarn through each hole in an up and down motion.
- Step 5: Older children might enjoy sewing the leaves together to make a curtain, skirt, or banner. If your child enjoys this, try sewing other natural materials or offer fabric.
